### Volunteers Needed!

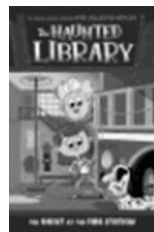

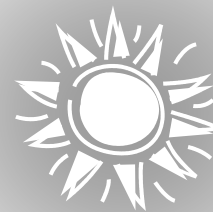
